



- First Professor for child health PNG
- Born 1935 in England, moved to Australia
- 1954 came to PNG as 3rd year medical student at Sydney University
- •1961 employed by NDoH & posted to Angau MH, Lae
- •1962 Recruited to teach at the newly established Papuan Medical College Appointed as first Professor of Child Health at UPNG

1991 Retired to Australia after 30 years of outstanding service and contribution to child health services of PNG 1993 Developed Acute Leukaemia 1998 Died in Brisbane
