This is a resource for paediatricians and health care workers to ensure the protection and safety of children.

Child protection in Papua New Guinea

Papua New Guinea has ratified the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC).

Department for Community Development and Religion, National Office of Child and Family Services

The Office of Child and Family Services co-ordinates the implementation of the Lukautim Pikinini Act and Policy.

National Department of Health

The National Department of Health (NDOH) includes child protection in health plans, policies, budgets and data. The NDOH is also involved in scaling up Family Support Centres and incorporating a parenting programme for violence prevention in Antenatal care (ANC) and immunisation (EPI) programmes.

Our responsibilities for child safety

Recognising child abuse

Child abuse is defined as all forms of physical or mental violence, injury or abuse, neglect or negligent treatment, maltreatment or exploitation, including sexual abuse, perpetrated by any adult, be that person a relative or stranger.

A child should be under the care of a nurturing and responsible adult: a parent or parents, legal guardian(s), or any other person who has the responsibility of care for the child.

The PNG Standard Treatment Manual lists some signs or symptoms that may indicate that abuse or neglect may be occurring or may have occurred in the past.

Responding to child abuse

A child may disclose to an adult that they have been abused. This disclosure may occur to a parent, other relative, or to a professional such as a health care worker or teacher. The response to a child or young person's disclosure of abuse is very important to their ongoing safety and recovery.

Responses should be in the best interests of the child.

Mandatory reporting

Health care professionals and some other professionals¹ are mandated by law to report reasonable suspicion or awareness of possible, likely or actual harm to a child.

¹ Other professionals includes teachers, school principals, social workers, psychologists, family councillors, members of the clergy, lawyers, police officers, community based corrections officers, juvenile justice officers, correctional services officers, community development officers or office workers and operators or employees of early childhood care and development centres.

Reporting procedures

Confidentiality and fair treatment

All reports should be kept confidential and private and investigations should treat all parties fairly.
